Ofsted

In the second full week of the new academic year 2023, we had a full 3+ day inspection with the outcome of 'Good' for Overall Effectiveness with both Behaviour and Attitude and Personal Development achieving an 'Outstanding' grade.

- "Pupils are immensely proud of their school. They develop strong bonds with staff and feel listened to and well cared for. Those pupils who have been at the school for a longer period demonstrate excellent behaviour and attitudes, both in lessons and at social times."
- "Staff have high expectations for pupils. Pupils learn well in lessons and show resilience. They use several strategies that staff have taught them when they feel anxious or unsettled. As a result, pupils recognise what triggers their anxiety and know what to do to calm themselves."

An extensive range of trips and visits, alongside a well-thought-out personal development curriculum, prepares pupils very well for the future. By the time they leave school, pupils are ready to pursue their next steps, academically and also socially and emotionally."
