The feedback was extremely positive affording us with a 'Good' grading overall including two areas of 'Outstanding', Personal Development and Behaviour and Attitude.

I am pleased for you to see through reading our newsletter many of the wonderful learning opportunities our pupils have and how well they enjoy and engage in their learning. This wouldn't happen if it weren't for the dedication and incredible hard work that our amazing staff, parents, foster parents and Governors do to support the whole school community.
