The purpose of this Child Protection and Safeguarding Policy is to provide staff, volunteers and governors with the framework they need to keep children safe and secure in our school and to inform parents and carers how we will safeguard their children whilst they are in our care.

Any concerns are passed through the Designated Safeguarding Leads who are trained as 'Designated Child protection Officers' in our school in compliance with the 'sharing of information' guidance.
