As we come to the end of our 1st term of 24/25 and the end of 2024 we look back at a wonderful term and just how far we have come since September 2023. We have created a warm, colourful and caring environment where our pupils feel safe and happy enough to express their thoughts and feeling, where staff and pupils enjoyed coming to work/school.

DOJO REWARDS SO FAR


Poseidon Have celebrated their Dojo class milestones with rewards of hot chocolate and movie afternoon, non uniform and free time to play.


Atlantis chose to celebrate their class achievement points with, using the laptops to play dojo island, non uniform and our currently working towards enough points for ice cream sundaes.



Can you name the towns these Christmas lights are from?


